I hope everyone has had a restful and relaxing summer. We are looking forward to seeing student and staff back in the building for our first day of school which is scheduled on August 23rd. There are a handful of staffing changes I would like to mention. The Board of Education hired Kelli Thobe as Elementary Principal, Macey Griesdorn as a fourth grade Language Arts teacher, Kalie Lenhart as a second grade teacher, Stephanie Wattercutter as an Intervention Specialist teacher, Tyler Prenger as an Elementary Physical Education teacher, Monica Homan, Deanna Springer, and Amy Bruns as Instructional Aides, Sheryl Lange as a Custodian, Renee Hartings added Asst. Technology coordinator to her job, Greg Bruns transferred from his Physical Education position to Agricultural Education and Danielle Hartke transitioned from Intervention Specialist to second grade. I would like to welcome all of our new employees to the district and invite the community to **Open House** on **August 21**st from **6:30 p.m.-8:30 p.m.** to meet them.

Over the summer, a portion of the high school roof was replaced, outdoor lighting was improved, and the high school gym floor was refinished. We will soon be upgrading some security systems and replacing many doors with grant money we obtained.

I am looking forward to the start of the 2023-2024 school year and our goal is to build on the successes from this past year. This year the following goals will be in place.

- Increase student Achievement.
- Be fiscally responsible to our tax payers.
- Continue to build trust in the community.
- Evolve in our understanding and use of Artificial Intelligence. Determine how it can be appropriately and responsibly used in education, while fitting the values of our community.
- Ensure that our community receives accurate communication for the tax levy in November.

- Technology: Increase the problem solving capacity of staff and students.
- Special Education: Maintain and increase graduation rates for all students including those with disabilities.

I am excited to see what this year brings and want to express my appreciation to the community for your support and the work you do with your children.

Welcome to the 2023-2024 school year! I hope you found time to relax and enjoy the extra time with family and friends during the summer months. The summer break is always appreciated, however, it is nice to return to a routine and a new beginning. As we begin this new school year, Marion Local Elementary School will welcome many new faces. 88 Kindergarten students, some attending preschool at Marion Local Elementary, will walk into the building for the first time together as the class of 2036!

As I begin my new position as Elementary Principal, I am excited to work alongside many great staff members and give back to the community that I live in! I am coming to Marion Local Elementary from Fort Recovery Elementary, where I served as their Elementary Principal. I reside in Chickasaw with my husband, Dustin, and 3 children.

In addition to welcoming the class of 2036, I want to also welcome new staff: Mrs. Stephanie Watercutter as Kindergarten - 2nd Grade special education, Ms. Kalie Lenhart as a 2nd Grade teacher, Ms. Macey Griesdorn as a 4th Grade teacher, Mr. Tyler Prenger as Kindergarten - 8th Grade Physical Education teacher, and Mrs. Monica Homan, Mrs. Amy Bruns, and Deanna Springer as a teacher's aides. To welcome the students back, the annual Back to School Night Open House will be held on Monday, August 21 from 6:30 - 8:30pm. Students and families are encouraged to visit their classroom(s) and meet their teacher(s) for the 23-24 school year. Students can bring in their school supplies. If you opted to purchase supplies through the School Supply Kits, the kits will be in your child's homeroom class. Book bills will also be in your child's homeroom class and can be paid in the Elementary

Office that evening. This is also a good time to check your child's lunch account, if they are a returning student.

For families who plan to drop off/pick up their child(ren) for arrival and/or dismissal, please follow the designated drop off/pick up route. Students in grades 4-8 should be dropped off at the main Elementary entrance and students in grades Kindergarten - 3 should be dropped off at the preschool doors. Students exiting the vehicle need to exit on the passenger side to eliminate the chance of a child walking near a moving vehicle. Similar to dismissal, students will be dismissed to the drive on the east side of the building (main elementary doors and preschool) and need to enter vehicles on the passenger side. We strongly encourage that you do not drop off your child(ren) prior to 8:10am. Students are dismissed at 3:15pm. Arrival and dismissal require patience - we will do our best to keep the traffic flow moving in a safe and efficient manner!

As a community, we have so much to be thankful and proud of! The work we do within the school is not done in isolation. The expectations, work ethic, and values are community driven. Education is a team effort and requires communication between home and school. As educators, we will do our best to communicate events, updates, and specific needs regarding your child. Student Chromebooks Grades 5 thru 12

All students in grades 5 thru 12 will have a Chromebook assigned to them for the 2023-2024 school year. Chromebooks will be carried to and from classes and home for students to complete



schoolwork. Students will receive their Chromebook on the first day of school. Students are responsible for the care and handling of their Chromebook. Damages such as a broken screen, missing keys, missing power cords, ect will result in extra charges to the student. Students are responsible for bringing Chromebooks to class every day and making sure they are charged and ready for class. Parent ProgressBook – Grades and Report Cards Online

ProgressBook is the system Marion Local Schools uses to provide parents

Cafeteria News

Each day, students will be able to purchase a reimbursable meal in the form of a salad or lunch. Each of these meals (salad or lunch) must have a minimum of 3 of the 5 components (meat/meat alternative, grain, fruit, vegetable, and milk) and one of those must be ½ cup fruit or vegetable.

The salad bar will again be offered to students in grades 3-12 daily. Breakfast items will be offered at the high school daily from 8:00-8:30 am (for grades 8-12).

Healthy, balanced meals are an important component in learning. Kids who eat healthy meals and move more, learn better in school. Ensuring your kids eat a healthy breakfast at home will allow them to concentrate more in the classroom and function better until lunch.

We are always looking for extra help in our cafeterias in the form of volunteers and subs. We also currently have a 2 hour paid position open at the elementary. Contact Renee Hartings (hartingsr@marionlocal.org) for more information.

We will allow students in grades 3-12 to purchase extra items (extra sandwich/fruit/milk/juice, etc) or ala carte (snacks are offered 1-2 times/week), for an additional cost. Students will only be allowed to purchase these items if they have a positive balance in their account. If you have any questions about this information, call us for clarification. Also, if parents are living at separate addresses, we'll send a copy of the material to both. Just be sure to notify us of your addresses so that we can keep both of you informed.

Fourth, we send out grade cards and interim reports to notify you of your child's progress in school. There is a definite link between home-school communication and student success. The more informed and involved both parents are in a child's school life, the better the child does. Therefore, it's important for us to communicate with you as often as we can and to seek your involvement in your child's school life. Your child will be the beneficiary, and that's our purpose...to serve you and your child.
