There are a handful of staffing changes I would like to mention. The Board of Education hired Paige Clune as a first grade teacher, Caitlyn Homan as a third grade teacher, Sophia Hoelscher as an Agricultural Education teacher, Laden Delawder as a high school intervention specialist, Sandy Ranly as an Instructional Aid, Sue Bruns as Elementary Assistant Principal, and Molly Goudy Instructional Aid. The Mercer County Educational Service center is utilizing grant funding to offer some additional staffing to support our district and we welcome Kristin Hange as an additional Title 1 teacher and Megan Gross as an SEL coach. ## Communication with Parents Is Important

### Working Together for Children

We know that when the home and school communicate frequently and thoroughly, it's an asset to children. It's a fact that if parents and teachers work together, children perform better in school. Even a child's attitude toward school is affected by parent-teacher communication. And if parents know what their children are doing in school and show their children that they believe that education is important, their children will tend to believe it too. Therefore, communicating with parents is one of our top priorities.

There are several vehicles we can use to communicate with parents. First, at the start of the school year, we hold an open house. This year it is on Monday, August 22<sup>nd</sup> from 6:30 – 8:30 pm and it allows parents to become acquainted with teachers, the curriculum, school policies, and classroom rules and regulations.

Second, we schedule parent-teacher conferences throughout the year. The important thing is that parents know what is happening. With more knowledge about school, you will have more opportunities to talk to your child about his or her work at school-and to influence his or her attitude toward teachers, class work, and school.

In addition, if at any time during the school year you notice a problem with your child or have any questions or concerns about your child's life at school, you have an open invitation to call and arrange a conference. We are available for conferences throughout the school year-not just for regularly scheduled parent teacher conferences.

Third, we periodically send newsletters, notices of achievements, and special announcements home with your child so that you are aware of what's happening at school. If you have any questions about this information, call us for clarification. Also, if parents are living at separate addresses, we'll send a copy of the material to both. Just be sure to notify us of your addresses so that we can keep both of you informed.

Fourth, we send out grade cards and interim reports to notify you of your child's progress in school. There is a definite link between home-school communication and student success. The more informed and involved both parents are in a child's school life, the better the child does. Therefore, it's important for us to communicate with you as often as we can and to seek your involvement in your child's school life. Your child will be the beneficiary, and that's our purpose...to serve you and your child.

## Elementary Principal's Message

I hope that everyone has had a great summer. Every year it seems that summer passes by more quickly than the previous. The staff and I are very excited to start the 2022-2023 school year. We are welcoming 90 new kindergarteners to school this year making our total building enrollment 667 students.

We would like to welcome several new staff members to the elementary school. Mrs. Sue Bruns has been hired to be the assistant principal as well as continuing with her role of special education director. Sue will now be in the elementary full time. Ms. Paige Clune, a 2017 graduate of Marion Local, will be teaching 1<sup>st</sup> grade this year. Mrs. Caitlin Homan has been hired to teach 3<sup>rd</sup> grade. Caitlin was a student teacher in 3<sup>rd</sup> grade last year and will also be coaching junior high volleyball this fall. A special note for me is that Caitlin was a student of mine in my last 5<sup>th</sup> grade class as a teacher in New Knoxville. Mrs. Kristin Hange will be teaching 2<sup>nd</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup> grade reading intervention as well as helping with different literacy initiatives for the elementary. Mrs. Megan Gross has been hired to help with social emotional needs of our students. Megan will be splitting her time between Marion and St. Henry. Both Kristin and Megan were hired through grants obtained through the Mercer County ESC. We have also hired two new instructional aides for the coming school year, Mrs. Sandy Ranly and Mrs. Molly Goudy. We welcome all of these professionals to Marion Local!

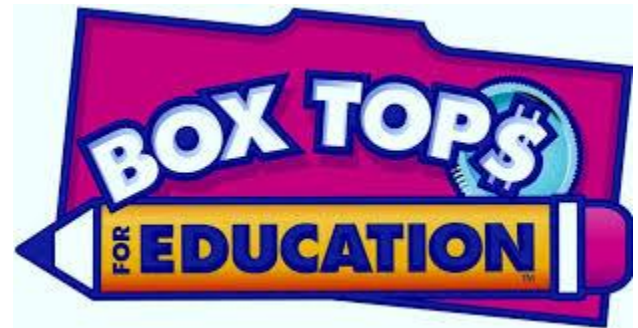
Our annual Back to School Night Open House is scheduled for Monday, August 22<sup>nd</sup> from 6:30-8:30pm. All classrooms will be open for students to unpack their supplies for the year. School supply kits ordered last spring will also be in student homerooms that night. Book bills for the school year will be in student homerooms and able to be paid in the elementary office during open house. In addition, we will have a brief meeting with all 5<sup>th</sup> and 6<sup>th</sup> grade parents at 8:00pm in the cafeteria to go over details about the upcoming Camp Wilson trip.

A reminder to all parents who drop off and pick up their students from school that this is now done from the front of the elementary. All 4<sup>th</sup>-8<sup>th</sup> grade students should be dropped off at the main entrance and all K-3<sup>rd</sup> grade students should be dropped off at the preschool doors. Please remember that all students should exit cars from the passenger side. In order for dismissal to be as smooth as possible in the afternoon we ask that all drivers not leave much space between cars and reinforce that students **MUST** enter vehicles through passenger side doors so as not to come in contact with any potential moving vehicles on the driver side.

We have so much to be proud of our school and all the work that takes place to make this one of the best places to learn in the state. No staff member takes for granted the trust you place in us to care for and educate your children in addition to the high expectation our community has for this school system.

We hope that everyone has had a chance to install the Boxtops for Education app from either the Apple Store and Google Play. The directions to download the app and use it are very simple. Once downloaded, all you need to do is scan store receipts and the app will count all eligible Boxtop purchases and log it for our school. Boxtops is a very profitable fundraiser for our school and without this funding, we would not be able to offer the different assemblies, student incentives, and prizes (like Skyzone and bowling trips). PBIS update: PBIS stands for Positive Behavioral Interventions and Supports. Legislation requires all

school districts in the state of Ohio to have a PBIS team and implementation plan. We have embraced this concept because at the heart of PBIS, we are trying to teach students how we prevent poor choices and behaviors. Throughout the course of the school year, we will use this district newsletter to share how Marion Local is implementing PBIS. Last year our students were introduced to some different PBIS behaviors by being taught and modeled proper hallway, bathroom, cafeteria, and recess behaviors. We will work hard to reinforce these concepts when school starts and to also teach the students what it means to “Be A Flyer.” Students will know that to “Be A Flyer” means to always: Be Ready, Be Responsible, and Be Respectful.”

### Student Attendance at Football Games

The attendance of the entire student body of Marion Local Schools is encouraged for all sporting events. It is important that we all work to ensure a safe environment for not only football games, but all sporting events held in our school and when visiting other schools. We ask parents to please review these simple guidelines with your children.

1. Respect for our country should be shown during the playing and singing of the National Anthem. Students are asked to remove all hats and stand respectfully facing the flag.
2. Good sportsmanship should be displayed at all times. Students are also to remember that all school rules apply (including disciplinary consequences) at all after school events.

### **Student Chromebooks Grades 5 thru 12**

All students in grades 5 thru 12 will have a Chromebook assigned to them for the 2022-2023 school year. Chromebooks will be carried to and from classes and home for students to complete schoolwork. Students will receive their Chromebook on the first day of school. Students are responsible for the care and handling of their Chromebook. Damages such as a broken screen, missing keys, missing power cords, etc will result in extra charges to the student. Students are responsible for bringing Chromebooks to class every day and making sure they are charged and ready for class. Students should report any problems they are having with their Chromebook to the

All computers used by students at school including Chromebooks are subject to an internet filter. Marion Local has to follow the guidelines set forth in the Children's Internet Protection Act (CIPA). Anywhere the student uses the Chromebook with an internet connection such as home or school the internet will be filtered. ## 2022-2023 HS Class Schedule Pick-up

### Cafeteria News

Each day, students will be able to purchase a reimbursable meal in the form of a salad or lunch. Each of these meals (salad or lunch) must have a minimum of 3 of the 5 components (meat/meat alternative, grain, fruit, vegetable, and milk) and one of those must be ½ cup fruit or vegetable.

The salad bar will again be offered to students in grades 3-12 daily. Breakfast items will be offered at the high school daily from 8:00-8:30 am (for grades 8-12).

Healthy, balanced meals are an important component in learning. Kids who eat healthy meals and move more, learn better in school. Ensuring your kids eat a healthy breakfast at home will allow them to concentrate more in the classroom and function better until lunch.

We are always looking for extra help in our cafeterias in the form of volunteers and subs. We also currently have a 2 hour paid position open at the elementary. Contact Renee Hartings ([hartingsr@marionlocal.org](mailto:hartingsr@marionlocal.org)) for more information.

A volunteer will come to the elementary to assist the K-2 students with their lunches (lasts about an hour). ***Free meals are now over***, so meals will go back to being ***paid by parents*** this school year. If your family meets the income guidelines for free or reduced meals, it is very important to fill out an application for review.

## Military Student Identifier

Districts are required to identify students whose parents or legal guardians have been active members of the Armed Forces or National Guard at any time throughout the current school year.
